Best cleaning method for elaborate designs

If you own a lot of stainless steel jewelry with [intricate designs](#), chances are you have a hard time reaching the nooks and crannies when trying to clean them.

You're not doing anything wrong. No matter how hard you try, it's impossible to get rid of all the dirt in such pieces with a cloth.

The best way on how to clean stainless steel jewelry with elaborate designs is to use an ultrasonic cleaner. Ultrasonic cleaners use intense vibrations to get to all the areas a piece of cloth can't reach.

However, if your jewelry has gemstones, it's not advisable to use an ultrasonic cleaner. The vibrations may damage the gemstones or loosen them from their mounting.

Achieve professional results with this cleaning method

If your goal is to get professional-like results, a stainless steel cleaner will not disappoint.

Because these products are made to be used to clean stainless steel, you can rest assured that they'll restore your jewelry's sparkle and shine.

However, you should know that not all cleaners are equal. Some are more potent than others. So research and find out what other people are saying about the product before buying.

Restore shine with this household item

If you're on a tight budget, there are incredible DIY cleaners you can use.

The first option is to use mild dish soap and water. Dish soap is an excellent cleaner for getting rid of grease, which is the most common type of grime in jewelry because it's always in contact with your skin.

For this DIY cleaner, you'll need mild dish soap, warm water, a lint-free cloth, polishing cloth, and two bowls.

Fill the bowls with the warm water and add two to three drops of the dish soap to one of the containers. Next, dip the lint-free cloth into the soapy water and begin cleaning your jewelry, making sure you cover the grain of the stainless steel for excellent results.

Once you've wiped off all the dirt and grime, rinse the jewelry in the bowl of water without soap and finish off by polishing the [stainless steel](#) with a polishing cloth.

The DIY mix that never disappoints

Baking soda has got to be the most versatile household item. It's excellent at masking odors and does a great job at getting rid of stains. For this reason, it's a useful stainless steel jewelry cleaner.

For this hack on how to clean stainless steel jewelry, you'll need one tablespoon of baking soda, a toothbrush, and half a tablespoon of water.

Combine the ingredients to make a thick paste and begin cleaning. Dip the bristles of the toothbrush into the mixture and use it to rub the paste onto your jewelry, making sure to clean all the nooks and crannies. For hard to reach areas, you can use a toothpick.

Once everything is spotless, rinse the jewelry and dry it with a soft towel.

You'll notice that the jewelry isn't as shiny as it originally was. Don't panic. Baking soda doesn't restore the luster, but you can quickly fix that. Add a few drops of olive oil to a piece of cloth and wipe your jewelry with it. And voila! The sparkle is back

Another household item that works wonders

If you're looking for a cleaning method that will clean and polish your jewelry in just a few steps, toothpaste will get the job done. It's a handy item for getting rid of tarnish and grime.

However, don't use just any toothpaste. For cleaning stainless steel, the only toothpaste that will work without damaging your jewels is plain white toothpaste.

Toothpaste with whitening agents and other additives may be too harsh and may cause scratches. Gel toothpaste, on the other hand, isn't abrasive enough to polish the metal.

All you need to do is to apply the toothpaste on a clean, soft damp cloth and wipe your jewelry with it. If your jewelry has gemstones, avoid rubbing the toothpaste close to the gems because it may loosen its mounting.

Finish off by rinsing off the excess toothpaste in warm water. Dry the jewelry with a soft cloth immediately to avoid water damage.

An excellent cleaner with disinfectant properties

Whether your jewelry is in storage or you're wearing it, it comes into contact with a lot of dirt and dust, which can cause a build-up of bacteria.

Therefore, it's not enough to clean it and call it a day; you also need to disinfect all your jewels to ensure they're safe to wear.

Fortunately, you won't need to buy an expensive product for this. With white vinegar, you can clean and disinfect your jewels in one step.

White vinegar has disinfectant properties and is an excellent cleaner not only for stainless steel but also [silver](#), [gold](#), and other gemstones.

For this cleaning method, you'll need one cup of warm water, one cup of white vinegar, a spray bottle, and a soft cloth.

After mixing the ingredients, you can clean the jewelry in two ways. First, you have the option of letting the jewels sit in the mixture for a few minutes before removing the remaining dirt manually and rinsing.

Alternatively, you can pour the mixture into a spray bottle and spritz the mixture on the cloth and wipe the jewels. Whichever method you choose, the results are the same.

Proper Storage and Maintenance

Now that you know how to clean stainless steel jewelry at home, it's also essential to understand how to store and maintain your jewels for enhanced durability.

The best thing about stainless steel is that it's durable and requires little maintenance. However, you can't just throw it inside your jewelry box any old way. While it may not get scratched, chances are it will scratch your other more delicate pieces.

The best way to [store](#) stainless steel jewelry is to separate them from the more delicate pieces. And if you want all your jewelry in one container, consider wrapping the stainless steel pieces in a soft-tissue paper or cloth.

And don't forget to clean them often to maintain their shine!
